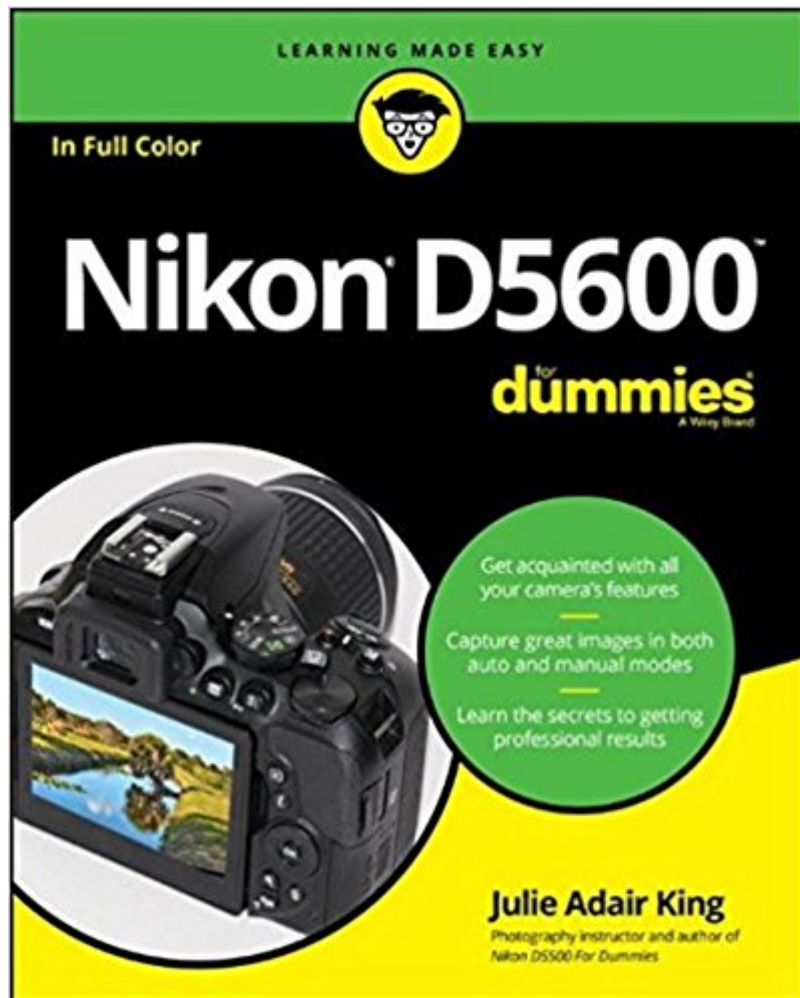

Cell phone cameras have come a long way in recent years and can now take pretty good photos. An SLR camera will still take tremendously better photos in almost situations, except that the SLR is much bigger than a cell phone so you probably won't carry it with you everywhere. SLR cameras are much more complicated than cell phone cameras and give you many more controls to customize your photo. The auto mode on an SLR really just scratches the surface of what your camera can do for you. The camera's user manual can get you started, especially if you already have experience with other SLR cameras, but if you really want to quickly learn to take advantage of

your camera's capabilities, I recommend a book like this one. I have not read other D5600 books, but this one is pretty good. The book included general information on how to use SLR cameras as well as specific information about how these features are implemented in the D5600. There are lots of photos of the camera to show you where the controls are located. More importantly, there are lots of "through the lens" photos showing you what you would see as you adjust the controls of the camera and final images showing you how the controls affect your photos. All of this information is seamless so you can read the book from cover to cover without having to jump around, like how some other camera reference books are organized. If you already have SLR experience, the first few chapters of this book may be slowly paced for you (or maybe not). If the D5600 is your first SLR, I think this is an excellent way to start.

First I must say that I am a Vine reviewer and received this book in exchange for an honest review. The Vine program was designed by Amazon to generate reviews of new products. This Camera for Dummies book is great, this Nikon D5600 for dummies, is my second one. I also have the Canon 80D for dummies, which is great. It's better than an instruction manual, it's everything the camera does expand in easy to read format. It's also like a photo class in a book as well. You learn about the fundamentals of photography, including photo tips and also instruction on using this camera to get the results you want. This is great for anyone who is thinking about getting a D5600 or for someone who already has it; you may discover your camera can do a lot more than you knew.

You've just got yourself a Nikon D5600 DSLR camera and you want to know how to get the most out of it. Whether this is your first DSLR or an upgrade from another camera, should you get the Nikon D5600 for dummies guide? The "for dummies" guides are really anything but for dummies. Yes, this book will take you through the absolute basics so that you know what you are doing without having any prior knowledge, but they are far more than that. They give you much more than the absolute basics. The Nikon D5600 for dummies starts off with the very basics of familiarising yourself with your new camera. What all the buttons do, how to insert and remove your memory cards, the different sockets found on the left side of the camera, what all the different menu options are etc. and basically gets you into a position where you can shoot. The next smaller section takes you through the basics of choosing a shooting mode, what the different options are and how they affect your photograph (the more advanced PASM modes are explained in more detail later in the book), how and when to use the built-in flash, the different shooting modes (high speed, single shot etc) and the differences between RAW and JPG and what you should shoot. Something this author has,

in my opinion, got correct versus authors of other dummies guides is his explanation of RAW vs JPG and which you should shoot. She gives a good explanation of the differences between each and then basically points you down the road of shooting RAW + JPG. This way you can quickly offload the JPGs and post immediately to Facebook, Instagram etc. and take your RAW's home to process and get the best possible results from. The book then goes on to explain how to shoot with the automatic modes, using live view (the back touchscreen rather than the viewfinder), shooting movies, downloading your images and movies from the camera to your computer (or phone/tablet) and even starts into some more advanced topics like bracketing, HDR and exposure compensation. Each function is explained in a step by step fashion so that you know exactly what to press and what settings you need in order to do it. The book also makes great use of full color photographs showing you exactly which buttons on the camera to press, which menu functions to choose or gives you examples of the end results of the function that it is talking about. This might sound a little strange but the use of full color photographs in a book about photography is excellent. I have seen books (and manuals) that are only black and white and it doesn't really work too well. Also spread throughout the book are fairly good tips on taking photographs to get the most out of your new D5600 (although the tips apply to any camera like how to hold the camera when not using a tripod etc). At the end of the day however the best tip the author gives is to go out and shoot. Like anything else, learn about something then go and use it. Experiment to see what works in what situations. Change your ISO setting, your aperture setting and take the same shot 4 or 5 times with different settings. The more you experiment and use your gear, the better your photographs and videos will become. This book will take from the absolute basics to advanced functions that you might not use all that often (but it is good knowing about them) and explains all the settings the D5600 has much better than the included Nikon manual. The author has done a great job of taking you from absolute basics of just how to use the camera to fairly advanced functions like bracketing and done it in an easy to learn way.

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
