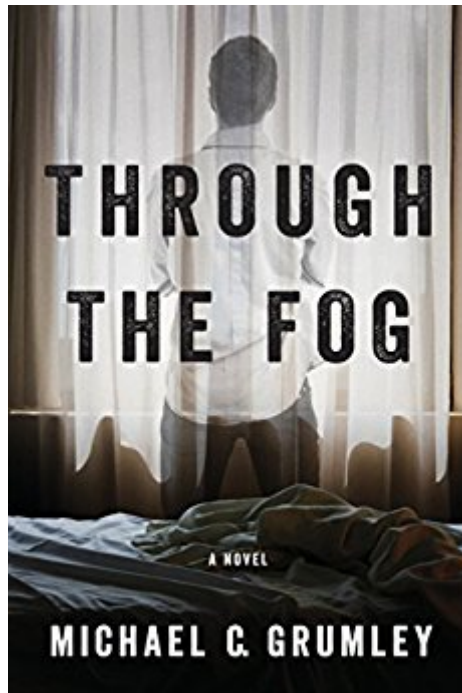




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Through The Fog

Book had enough suspense to keep me reading, although not a lot happens for the first 3/4 of the book. Story revolves around a married couple having had their daughter kidnapped nearly two years ago and a young man whom enters their life when the mother/therapist becomes aware of his ability to see things in his visions. There is a side story revolving around her acquaintances uncovering the mystery of another case similar to Evans, but what saved this book for me was when the mother confronts the kidnapper and all hell breaks loose. Some inconsistencies, some misdirection, but generally well-written and a fast read given it's brevity that for me finished up being a 4 star read.
