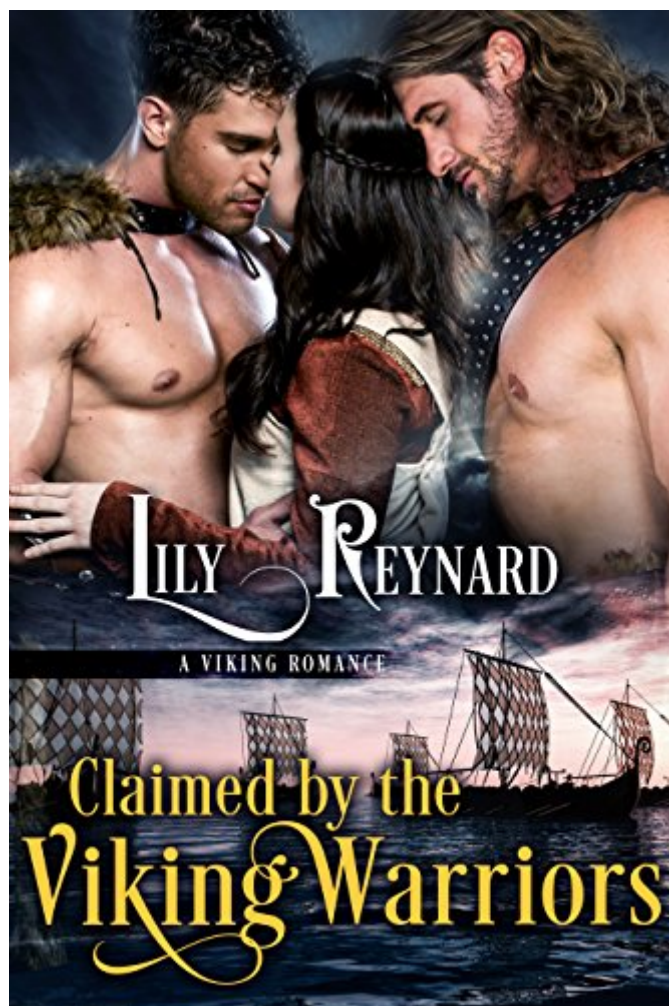


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Claimed By The Viking Warriors

Okay, so I confess I got this book in part because the cover design is terrible, and the title is so very flat. I figured, "It's free, so I might as well!" And, well, I was pleasantly surprised! The plot is excellent and believable, weaving history in with a deft touch, and the sex was smoking hot. Eadyth is a lady who knows herself well, and, despite being put in poor situations, has a lot of agency and knowingly makes choices that could have been terrible for her - but of course they turn out excellently. ;) Hjalmar and Leif are clearly smoking hot (...I may have spent most of the book picturing them as MCU's Thor and Loki), honorable, clever, and very, very good to Eadyth, which is all to their credit. I liked that Eadyth was such a strong, courageous, and knowledgeable high-born Saxon maiden. I like that she inherits her father's prosperous estate and that she does everything in her power to resist her villainous uncle's matrimonial schemes to her nine-year-old first cousin. Her villainous uncle wants her to marry his son so that he can control both estates against the warring Kings. Eadyth wants the right to find her own husband; she finds herself outnumbered when her warriors side with her villainous uncle and swear loyalty to him. Eadyth manages to escape the estate and walks to her other uncle's monastery to see if he will help her against his brother. the uncle's plans are disrupted when the monastery is attacked by Viking raiders, and innocent Eadyth finds herself the captive to two fierce Norse chieftains, each of them a mouth-watering specimen of muscular, virile masculinity. She ends up negotiating with the chieftains to become one of their wives in exchange for the safety of the monks in the monastery and the people in her estate and the chieftains agree, so long as they can start their courtship that night.
