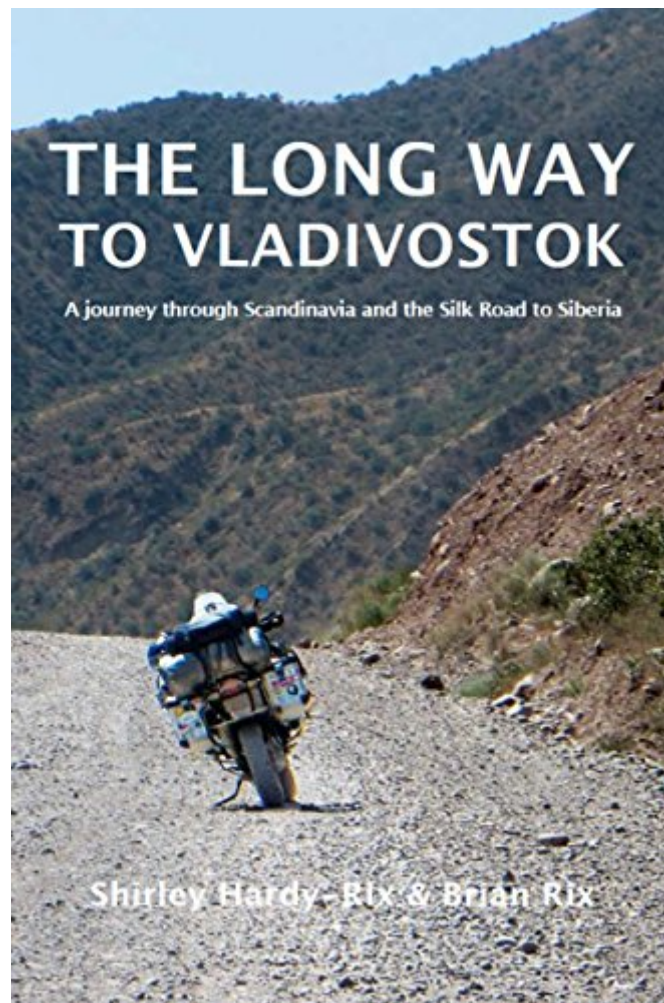




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# The Long Way To Vladivostok: A Journey Through Scandinavia And The Silk Road To Siberia
