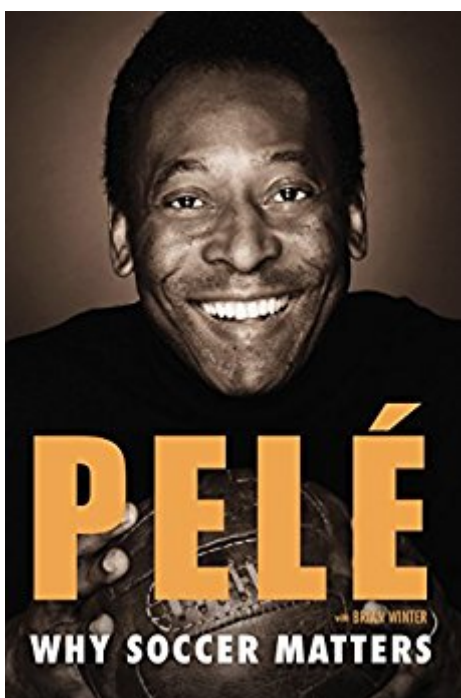

While reading "Why Soccer Matters" I find myself telling those around me Why Pele Matters, not just to me, but to so many millions of people in this world.
