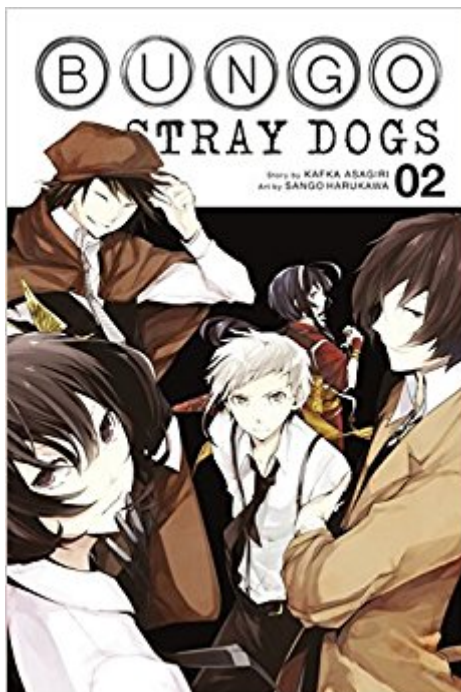

But you know what? It's worth it. This series rocks. As does this particular volume. Bungo Stray Dogs is a prime example of a manga that manages to be action-packed and serious while also making you laugh. This volume has the perfect balance of action, character development, humor, and world-building. Each character has his or her own quirks, which keeps the relatively large cast of characters from blending together. We met a few new people since volume 1 and they're all intriguing. They each have very distinct looks, as well, something that the illustrator (Sango Harukawa) did that excellent job of emphasizing. Speaking of which: This manga has exceptional artwork. I could look at it all day. The world that this series takes place in is fascinating. The urban, modern-day setting goes very well with the supernatural skills that most of the characters possess. It's also a cool touch because that the characters are based off of 20th century Japanese authors, each having personality traits or magical skills that are nods to their respective authors.
