

This book is fantastic for elementary music teachers, and so is the entire series. If you are a Kodaly trained music educator, you sing a lot of folk music to your kids and with your kids. These books take the counting song "Over in the Meadow" and change the location and the animals in the story. For the most part, they're great. Nice pictures, good rhymes, and location-specific vocabulary. The part my students like best is that the number of animals you are singing about on a page is hidden somewhere on that page. They LOVE to try to find it. I highly recommend these "Over in the Meadow" alternatives.
