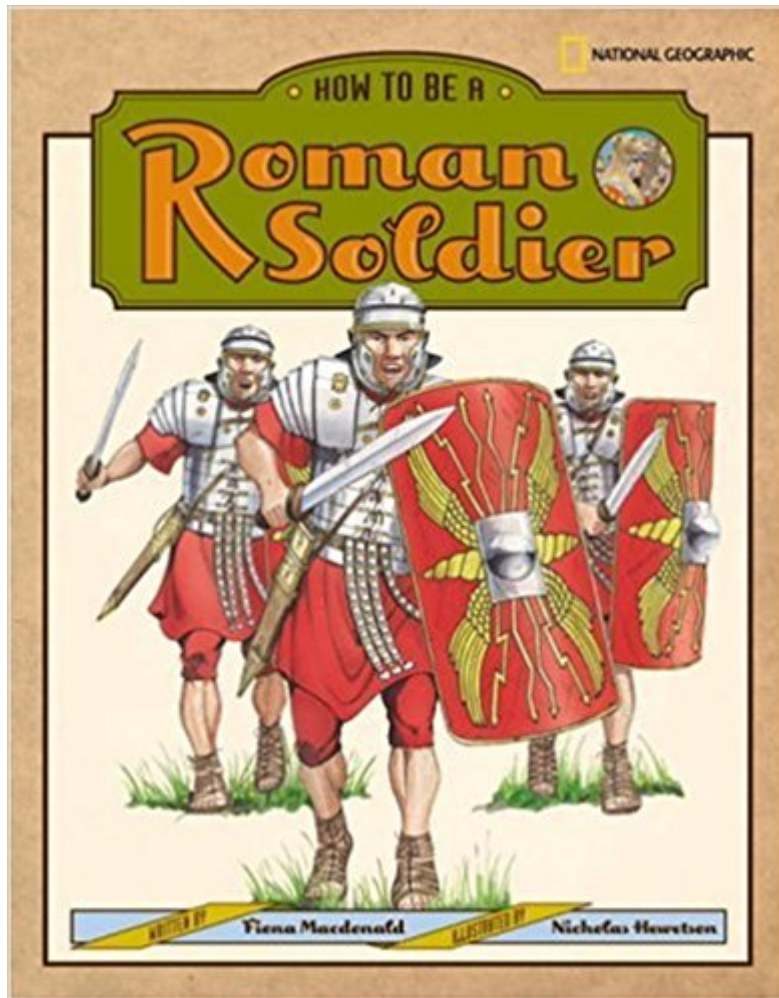

Its not thick but full of colour and easy to read facts that allow the child to utilise their imagination and step into the shoes of a roman soldier, eg: where they sleep and how small the quarters are, what they were issued with and who paid for it, rules with marriage and what the perks of being an officer are like and what they would expect to do everyday when not off fighting
