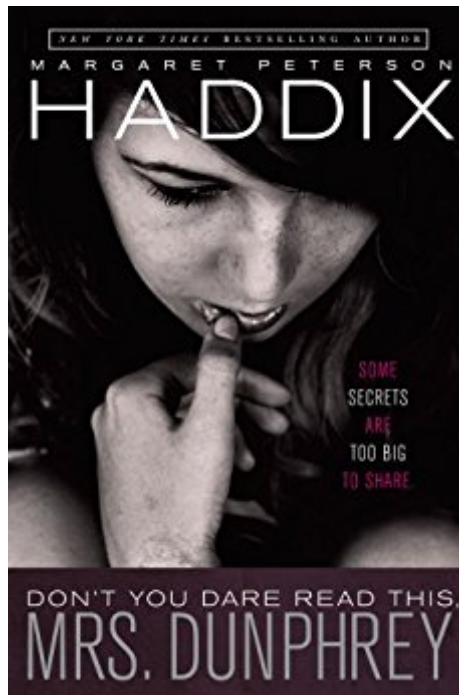




The book was found
