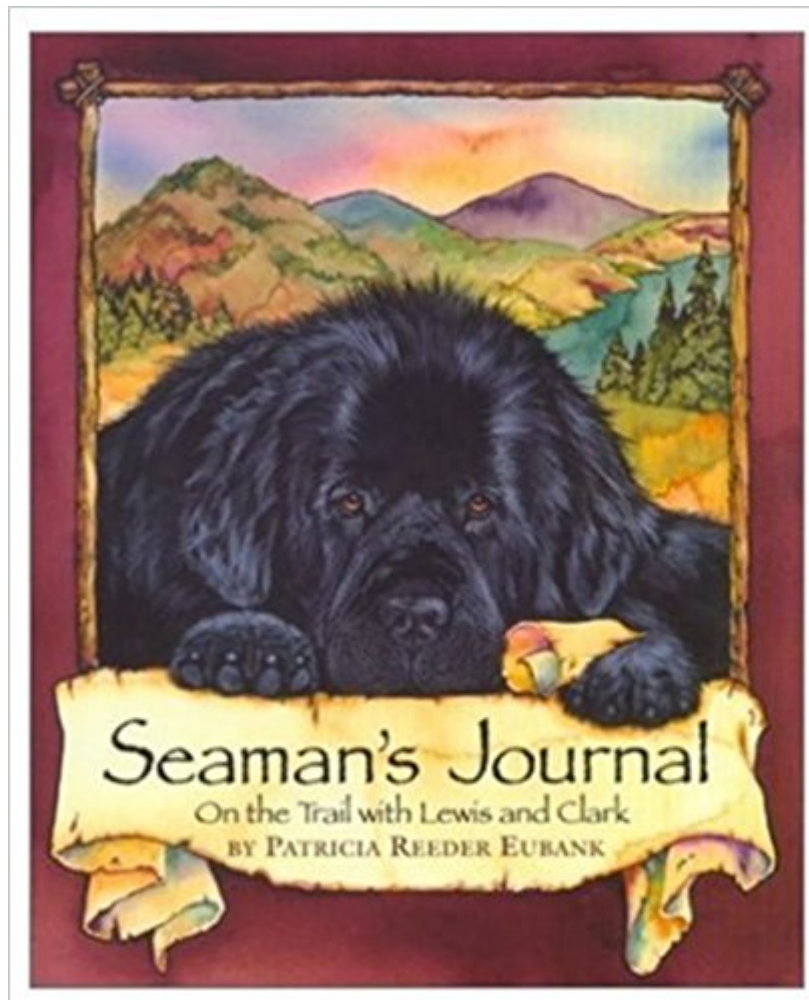

Absolutely adorable! We love it. Highlights of Lewis and Clark's journey from the eyes of their dog, Seaman.

I knew a little about Seaman because I had seen his full-size bronze statue at the Lewis and Clark Center in Washburn, ND. But I did not know about all his adventures on the long trip with the explorers, as described in his own voice in this book. And the illustrations, especially of his

expressive eyes, made me feel that I had the real live Seaman in front of me. There are additional illustrations on each page which are both beautiful and instructive: Indians from a number of tribes, wild animals encountered on the trip, birds, flowers, and plants. This book should be a treasure to a young reader, and - hopefully - encourage him or her to want to learn more about The Lewis and Clark Expedition.
