

I bought this book as a gift for a friend who plans to go to Ireland this fall. She is thrilled with the thoroughness and currency of the information. Another friend who already has bicycled in Ireland admired the book as being a great guide.

This is a useful book.I have one comment about the ride. Most guides say to ride the Ring of Kerry in a counter-clockwise direction. Having just done it, I strongly disagree, for three reasons. First, everyone gets the same advice, so 70% of car traffic is going that way. I prefer my odds against the 30%. Second, the prevailing wind is south to north. If you ride the way suggested you'll have a headwind much of the way. Third, if you ride clockwise you will always be on the ocean side of the road. It's prettier and has a wider margin.Pretty much the same advice applies all the way up the west coast. Go south to north. You'll have the wind at your back, better views, and fewer cars.
