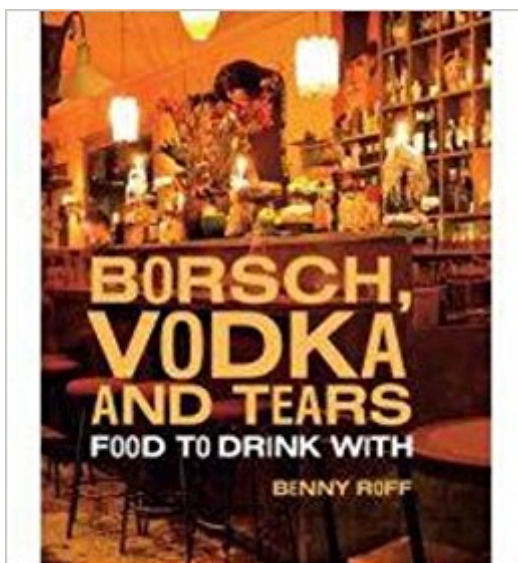


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Borsch, Vodka & Tears: Food To Drink With

Split into three chapters: Tears is the restaurant's colorful history; Vodka is a definitive guide to Polish vodkas, including vodka tasting notes, the restaurant's most popular cocktail recipes, and how to match vodka with food; and Borsch features warming Polish classic recipes such as cabbage rolls, blintzes, and beetroot soup, as well as modern dishes, desserts, and sharing plates. Edgy photography, a comprehensive vodka guide, and delicious recipes make Borsch, Vodka & Tears unique and an instant classic!
