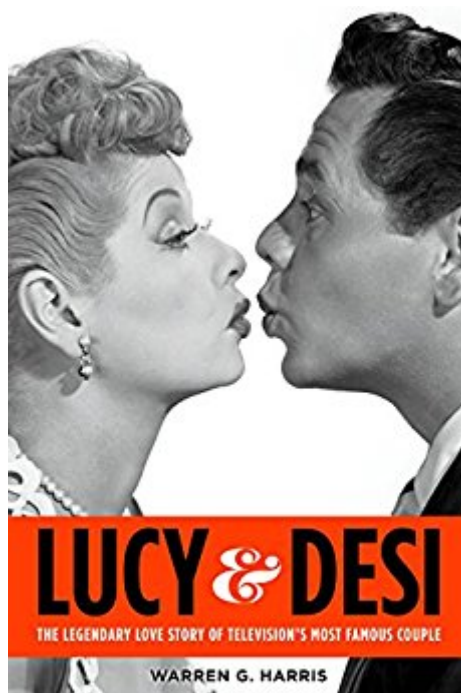




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Lucy & Desi: The Legendary Love Story Of Television's Most Famous Couple

I got this book used for 0.01 cent, in pretty good shape. I've read an awful lot of books on 50's tv, on its stars and shows. In that quest I've read nearly every book there is about Lucille Ball. This book

stands out because it's the one dedicated to both Ball and Desi Arnaz. The book covers both their lives in detail most have already read in other books. What makes it noteworthy are the rather candid comments and original quotes from those who worked with and/or knew them on a personal level. That gives the book credibility, to anyone who has an interest in the subjects, and must be taken seriously. It's not 'fluff'. For my money this is probably the best biography written with Ball and Arnaz together. If you have an interest in either I strongly recommend buying this book. It pretty realistic insight into their lives stands out from most of the others. At last count there are over 30 bio's on Ball. They cover the entire range from fairly indept, critical, fawning to out right worship. However, there isn't one book about Arnaz (alone). Another very good book on the two, 'Desilu' looks at their studio and their lives. Yet, Arnaz plays second fiddle to his more famous wife. This book at least gives Arnaz a fair shake and treats him as an equal to Ball. It doesn't make him out to be the ruthless and drunken womanizing bad guy, nor does it varnish over Ball and turn her into the innocent victim. Harris let's us in on the inside stuff, to let us 'breathe the same air as they did when the events happened'. By being fair to both Ball and Arnaz we learn that both had a part in their eventual break up. Arnaz contribution to their downfall is more dramatic, with his 'chasing anything in a skirt' and wholesale drinking and nasty temper scoring major points. But Ball had a quick temper herself, constantly hounding Arnaz about everything BUT Desilu and never really trying to understand the 'real' Desi Arnaz. She used to beat him up in more ways than one. Her dedication to her career was stronger than anything else in her life, to include Arnaz and their kids. Her perspective on him warped by her narcissism and her narrative on what an ideal marriage 'should' be. While Arnaz was the ultimate romantic, Ball was the complete opposite and could never figure why he was the way he was. His second wife did and managed to stay married until her death in 1985. Arnaz was the kind of guy who shouldn't have married as he loved the single life too much. Rich enough to get away with it he nonetheless loved Ball and their children. In a way, Ball got what she most wanted, becoming a major star in show business who had to be taken seriously. In reaching that goal she lost Arnaz and never really had the ideal family life she wanted. Her second marriage was a good example of the type husband she required: a docile, easy to manipulate man totally dedicated, attentive and controlled by her. Only an out of touch fool would believe that Arnaz could have filled the 'role'. Harris does a very good job with this book. It doesn't get much press in the world of Lucy Lore for some reason. I guess many Lucy fans might have some trouble with some of the real life and blunt events. But, it comes the closest yet to realistic book on the couple and shows us that they were, after all, just two real people with some serious issues. Harris should get credit for getting the truth out there. Ball and Arnaz are icons. People in 2115 may look back and

wonder who they were, but people will know that they did something important and that they were important people in 1955, et al. This book, if read then, will help them understand this complex, complicated couple a bit better. Make sure and read this book if you're interested in Ball or Arnaz. Also if you have an interest in 50's television, Desilu Studios and show biz in general. Until someone sits down and writes a bio dedicated to Arnaz alone, 'Lucy & Desi' and 'Desilu' will have to do. Highly recommend this book.
